## The Effect of Social Dominance Orientation on Sexual Prejudice Toward Homosexual Groups Among Heterosexual from Adolescents to Emerging Adulthood

Homosexual groups in Indonesia still face various forms of rejection due to sexual prejudice held by heterosexual individuals. One factor suspected to influence this prejudice is Social Dominance Orientation (SDO), which refers to an individual's tendency to support social hierarchy and intergroup inequality. Therefore, this study aims to examine the influence of social dominance orientation on sexual prejudice among heterosexual from adolescents to emerging adulthood. The study involved 386 heterosexual respondents aged 12–25 years. The instruments used were the Social Dominance Orientation Scale (SDO7S) and the Attitudes Toward Lesbians and Gay Men (ATLG) Scale. This research employed a quantitative approach with logistic regression analysis, as the data were not normally distributed. The results showed that social dominance orientation has a positive influence on sexual prejudice with an odds ratio of 1.024 ( $R^2$ =0,037, p<0,003). This indicates that the higher an individual's social dominance orientation, the higher their level of sexual prejudice toward homosexual groups.
