

ABSTRACT

The Relationship Between Social Dominance Orientation and Dating Violence Among Adolescent Male Perpetrators Who Are Dating

Dating violence remains one of the forms of violence frequently reported to the National Commission on Violence Against Women (Komnas Perempuan). With 360 recorded cases, dating violence ranks third in the category of personal-based violence. This phenomenon indicates that many victims are caught in toxic relationships during dating, which have the potential to continue into marriage, thus becoming the beginning of domestic violence in the future. This study aims to determine whether there is a relationship between social dominance orientation and dating violence. This research was conducted on perpetrators of dating violence with a total of 266 subjects aged 14-21 years. Data collection used the SDO7 adaptation scale and the Conflict in Adolescent Dating Relationships Inventory (CADRI). The researcher used a quantitative method with data processing using correlation tests. The research results show a significant correlation between Social Dominance Orientation and Dating Violence of 66.8% ($\rho=0.668$, $p<0.001$). The conclusion of this study is that there is a significant relationship between social dominance orientation and dating violence among teenagers in relationships.
