ABSTRACT

House is one of the requirements to accommodate the basic human needs of human daily activities. One way to meet those needs is to live in a house with minimal land in densely populated environment. This minimal land does not suitable for the activities that the residents need. Hence, when humans use the space, there are two things that may happen which is adaptation and adjustment - humans adapt their activities to fit with their living environment and humans change the environment where they live to accommodate their activities. This thesis discuss the adaptation and adjustment of what happens in a house located in RT003/06 Kalianyar Village, Tambora, West Jakarta. By mapping and observing the house, conducted interviews with residents and applying quantitative methods, I identified two activities as a consequence of having to stay home with minimal land.
