

ABSTRACT

Framing the News of the Constitutional Court Decision: The Use of Education Places as Election Campaign Venues (Framing Entman Comparison Between Detik.com and Tribunnews.com for the August – September 2023 Period)

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The issue of the Constitutional Court's decision to allow educational places as election campaign venues caused controversy from various parties or groups in society. Various online media in Indonesia often report this issue in different ways. The varying viewpoints by each media make this issue interesting to study. The purpose of this study is to determine the framing of the issue of the Constitutional Court decision where education is the place of election campaigns on Detik.com and Tribunnews.com media. Both news sites are chosen with a certain value representation, Detik.com have more control in reporting another term as watchdog, while Tribunnews.com tend to be information media. This study uses the Entman model framing analysis research method, because the Entman model is suitable for seeing media framing related to government policy issues by providing definition, explanation, evaluation and recommendations on an issue. The period specified in this study is August to September 2023. The results of this study show differences in framing and interesting findings, where Detik.com in framing the issue of Constitutional Court decisions is more directed at the legal and social realms. Meanwhile, Tribunnews.com found to display more news that only quoted responses or opinions from various parties on the issue of the Constitutional Court decision that allowed educational places as campaign venues.
